

Dear Parent/Carer,

I hope that you and your families are keeping well.

This week is Anti-Bullying Week and the School recognised and promoted these key messages with students through assemblies and videos from the Anti-Bullying alliance. I know that you were also sent an advice, information and guidance pack aimed at parents and carers from the Anti-Bullying alliance, which if your son/daughter has unfortunately been affected by these issues, you may also be able to use at home to support them. Sadly, we know that as in life, bullying can happen in schools, but our message has been very clear to students this week – we have reminded them to report any school bullying to us, and to try and challenge this behaviour in others – not to support or 'go along' with it for example. More than this, we have really tried to encourage students to empathise with how bullying makes others feel and reminded students of the terrible effects that bullying has on people, and reinforced our whole school value to 'be kind'. We have reminded students that in coming to school they represent the values that they bring from home, and I know that you will work with us to remind your son/daughter of these messages, in particular to 'think' before they speak/act/press 'send' on a phone, and not to do anything that would make the person who they love and respect the most feel disappointed in them. Thank you for your support with this.

On Monday evening, our English department organised a theatre visit to the Royal Shakespeare Theatre in Stratford to watch 'A Christmas Carol.' It is fantastic that our students are offered repeated cultural opportunities to visit this wonderful theatre in our county (the home of Shakespeare!) with the highest of quality productions. We have been informed that our Year 11 English students and Year 10 Drama students behaviour was superb and everyone said that the show was a real treat! Thank you to their teachers for giving up their time to accompany the trip.

Thank you again to those parents and carers who have subscribed to Class Charts. ## Safe keeping of mobile phones during PE lessons

In order to support students with not having to leave their mobile phone unattended during their PE lessons, PE staff collect in mobile phones and place them securely in a box for students to collect at the end of the lesson. Please note that the School does not accept responsibility for loss or damage to phones collected in by PE staff and would be grateful if you would actively encourage your son/daughter to leave their phone at home on days that they have PE. Thank you.

## Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme - 2022/23 Academic Year:

The Department for Education (DfE) has made funds available to every Local Authority in England to co-ordinate free holiday provision, including healthy food and enriching activities. The HAF programme provides activities at Christmas, Easter & Summer school holidays, with funding available for children who receive benefits-related free school meals (Reception to Year 11).

### **HAF Entitlement:**

Eligible children can access funded sessions during main school holidays, with a breakdown provided below.

- A maximum of 4 sessions in the school Christmas holidays.
- A maximum of 4 sessions in the school Easter holidays.
- A maximum of 16 sessions during the school Summer holidays.

A session is normally a minimum of four hours inclusive of a food provision, but activity times/duration vary with each HAF provider.

#### What to do next:

- You will need to apply for your child's HAF Code by completing a brief online form. This form only takes a few minutes to complete, with a separate form required for each eligible young person. This is to ensure we have the correct contact details and your preferred method of how the HAF code is sent. We also require you to read and agree to our terms & conditions of the HAF programme. This form can be located from https://searchout.warwickshire.gov.uk/holidays-activities-food-haf
- Once your HAF codes are processed and sent, your child's unique code will last the academic year 2022-23 so there is no need for new codes to be re-issued for each holiday period. The code will be valid for Christmas, Easter & Summer holidays so please keep it safe. (We can always re-send it if it gets misplaced.)

#### How to book activities:

For the upcoming Christmas holidays, we will have the bulk of our HAF programme in place from Monday 19th December to Thursday 22nd December. There might be a few activities that run outside on these dates. All HAF information is available at <a href="https://searchout.warwickshire.gov.uk/holidays-activities-food-haf">https://searchout.warwickshire.gov.uk/holidays-activities-food-haf</a> with activity listings being available from Monday 21st November. You can then book sessions directly with your chosen provider using your unique HAF code, you will need to show this either at the time of booking or at your child's first session.
