The recent death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II reminded many of us of her visit to the School in December 1994, which some parents/carers who were students at Higham Lane School the time may recall. The School will be closed on Monday 19th September for the State Funeral.

One of the themes of our recent Parents' Information Evenings has been e-safety. The internet brings a range of benefits, however, it also has its downsides. The next page of this newsletter outlines some of the concerns we deal with daily in school. Unkind comments and pictures that are shared on social media can then lead to a range of difficult and upsetting situations for students and families. Please monitor your child's phone and regularly discuss their online activity. Remind them to be kind.

Issues arising from inappropriate comments and images made and/or shared on social media out of school time must be referred to the Police. As a school we will not investigate these. Any issues arising in school will continue to be investigated and students sanctioned accordingly. Appropriate use of social media is a theme we will be exploring with students over the coming weeks and one which I will return to in a future newsletter. Thank you for your support with this.

A date for your diary if you have children in Year 6 is Wednesday 5th October which is our School Open Evening. We are delighted that this is returning as an 'in person' event having been online for the past two years due to Covid-19 restrictions. Please note that School will be finishing early for all students at 2.15pm that day to allow us to prepare for the Open Evening.

The School is currently looking for Exam Invigilators and Lunchtime Supervisors. If you are interested or know of someone who might be, please visit the Job Vacancies section of the School website.

We are continuing to follow Warwickshire Local Authority's guidance regarding isolation due to Covid-19.
