Class Charts will allow you access to important information on your son/daughter's house points, behaviour, attendance, detentions and more. Teachers are also beginning to put homework activities on there too which will enable you to support your child with this important aspect of their learning. Class Charts is really easy to access, simply log in via the website www.classcharts.com or via their app, which is available via the Apple app store or Google Play store. We are so grateful for your support as parents/carers in ensuring that your son/daughter follows our school rules on uniform, hairstyles and equipment. Well done to our Year 11 students who have completed the first week of their trial exams. They have conducted themselves brilliantly by taking these exams seriously. One more week to go! Then they can look forward to detailed exam feedback from their teachers which will inform them of their strengths, and crucially, their next steps for improvement.

Year 10s took part in their Personal Development day on Thursday this week on the theme of Celebrating Difference & Equality. Workshops were based around knife crime, Women's Rights & Equality, LGBT Equality in the UK, Toxic Masculinity, the MeToo & Times Up Movement. Please take the opportunity to discuss with your son/daughter what they learnt from these workshops.

Last Monday a group of our Year 12 History, Law and Criminology students made a visit to Westminster for a guided tour of the Houses of Parliament and were given special access to both chambers. I'm sure that you will agree that this was a fantastic opportunity for the students involved and is just one of many experiences that we offer to students during their time at Higham Lane. This week's talk as part of the Memorable Moments Passport scheme was kindly delivered by Raveena Rai who talked to the students about media and film. Raveena is employed by the British and Irish Modern Music (BIMM) Institute which runs the Screen and Film School. They have campuses in Birmingham, Brighton and Manchester. Raveena gave a fascinating talk about the film making process and what it's like to study film making at university. The students, as always, were a fantastic audience and asked some probing and perceptive questions.

Raveena has also very kindly offered to host a 4 hour workshop for up to fifty five of our students at their Birmingham campus. Unfortunately the Screen and Film School can only host students in Year 10 and above for this visit. In this week's sports fixtures, our Year 7 A netball team drew 5-5 with St Martin's School whilst Year 7 B netball beat St Martin's 11-7. Well done to all our sports teams who have competed in fixtures recently.
