

Dear Parent/Carer,

I hope that you and your families have had a good week.

We were delighted to be informed by the Department for Education earlier this week that our new free school, Higham Lane North Academy, has moved a step closer by progressing from the 'approved in principle' phase to the 'pre-opening' phase. The process has now begun to appoint a contractor to build the School. We are very excited by this project as we feel that it will bring benefits to both schools, primarily through the sharing of best practice in curriculum design and teaching and learning across both institutions, joint opportunities for the students in both schools and the potential for sharing resources.

You will have seen my email yesterday regarding the unfortunate incident around the alleged sale of vapes to some of our students on the way home from school. We remind our students regularly that vaping is not only illegal for anyone under 18, but research also shows how damaging and dangerous it is. Buying vapes from a stranger is even more dangerous of course as there is no way of knowing fully what the vape may contain. I know that as parents/carers you will also be reinforcing the serious message at home with your son/daughter that vaping is illegal for anyone under the age of 18 and is also dangerous. The law surrounding vapes and vaping is there to protect young people. If students are found vaping/in possession of a vape at school, they can expect a serious sanction and you will of course be informed of this.

Within school, we have been really impressed with the overwhelming majority of Year 10s who have shown a mature and conscientious attitude towards their exams this week. Completing this set of exams is a crucial part of building exam stamina towards their final GCSE qualifications next year. As a school we take these exams very seriously as we work together with students and you as parents/carers to ensure that everyone in the year group can be as successful as they can be. As students enter their second week of examinations, we know that we can count on your support to keep them focused on their revision at home, and to praise them for their efforts, and in particular to thank you as parents/carers for your son/daughter's superb conduct in the examination venues. Teachers are looking forward to giving your son/daughter detailed feedback over the next few weeks which will celebrate their strengths and give them crucial advice on how to be even more effective.

On Monday, our 'Loyalty Card' revision scheme launches again for Year 11! We are really excited to find out which form will collectively attend the most revision sessions. This scheme is very popular with Year 11 students where attendance to revision sessions means they can choose from a range of rewards! Year 11s continue to impress all of their teachers with an exceptional attitude towards their GCSEs – it is their effort and perseverance that we know will bring them the GCSE success they desire! They have three weeks to go until their second set of trial exams, week beginning 6th February, and have been planning their time completing revision timetables with their form tutors over the last week. Thank you for your continued support and for working together with Mr Davies, Mrs Robinson and Year 11 teachers – we really appreciate this!

In sports news, our Year 7 netballers beat Bilton School 9-7. Unfortunately our Year 9 netballers narrowly lost 22-16 to Bilton in a high scoring game. The Year 10 netballers beat Twycross 16-8. Well done to everyone who took part.

Finally, welcome to three new staff who have joined us since the start of term. Miss Howe has joined our English department, Miss Vowles has joined us as our new Inclusion and Behaviour Intervention Officer and Mrs Connop has joined us as Pastoral Manager to Year 7 in place of Mr Morris who is taking on another pastoral role in the School. We wish both colleagues well in their new positions.
