On Wednesday of this week, I was delighted to be able to host a visit from George Smith, the Chief Executive Officer of Central England Academy Trust which Higham Lane School joined at the start of this term. I took Mr Smith on a tour of the School during his visit and we popped into classrooms, supervised a lesson changeover and went out on gate duty at the end of the day! I was keen for Mr Smith to see the School in operation. At the end of his visit he told me how impressed he had been by what he had seen and particularly by the students' behaviour. They are a real credit to our school.

Well done to our Year 7s who are continuing to settle in well. This week saw them completing CATS tests to help provide their teachers with further information about their ability across a range of different subjects.

I mentioned in last week's newsletter the role of our Junior Leadership Team and how voting was currently underway to select this year's JLT. From an initial 30 applicants, 14 students were interviewed by Mr Kelly and Mr Ireland and then went on to make short videoclips explaining why students should vote for them. They also took part in a Governors' Conference. The process has now drawn to a close and we've selected our team of students for JLT and from within the team, our two Head Students. We have been particularly impressed with our Year 11 students who are preparing so well for their trial examinations (week beginning 31st October). Over a hundred students attended the Religion and World Views revision session in Chine Hall after school on Monday of this week. All other subjects have been very well attended and many are now offering further sessions as students have been so enthusiastic to begin their revision in good time for their trial examinations. Students have also attended assemblies where revision strategies and managing a study/life balance have been covered and are collecting rewards for attending revision. We are grateful as well to our teachers for offering such a comprehensive range of revision sessions throughout the week for the students. Good luck to all our Year 11s with their revision over the next four weeks.

Over 150 students have signed up for the Memorable Moments Passport through our Able and Ambitious scheme. We are so impressed with students who want to go above and beyond by attending aspirational talks by outside speakers, volunteering time to help others/support the school, take part in charity events and attend extra-curricular clubs. This will really give those taking part 'the edge' and give them valuable opportunities to discuss this in their personal statements in readiness for their next steps beyond Higham Lane School. There is still time for your son/daughter to be involved if this is something s/he is interested in. A huge thank you to our many students in Years 8 to 11 who have volunteered to act as either a Student Ambassador or Department Helper for the School's annual Open Day next Wednesday 5th October. Without their support and cheerful, enthusiastic disposition Open Day would not be the success it is. A reminder that we will be closing early next Wednesday (at 2.15pm) so that we can prepare the School for Open Day.

We were delighted to receive the news this week that one of our former Higham Lane Sixth Form students, Zaynah Mulla, is one of only fifteen students in the West Midlands to have been selected for a bursary from the OCR exam board to support her studies. We wish Zaynah every success as she begins her studies at the University of Cambridge.







Our most-able female mathematicians in Key Stage 5 took part in the UKMT Mathematical Olympiad for Girls on Wednesday – a competition designed to encourage girls to tackle advanced mathematical opportunities. We look forward to sharing in their successes with them when we receive the results. These competitions are an excellent way of encouraging students to apply mathematical thinking, precision of thought and fluency to use mathematical techniques appropriate to their ability to solve interesting problems. There are a wide range of challenges available and we look forward to hosting the Senior Maths Challenge for our KS5 students on Tuesday 4th October, the Intermediate Maths Challenge for our most able Year 9–11 students on Wednesday 1st February 2023 and the Junior Maths Challenge for our most able KS3 students on Wednesday 26th April 2023.
