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Supported Internship Event

We would like to invite you to attend a special event on Thursday 14 March 2024, 3pm to 7pm at Eliot Park Innovation Centre, Nuneaton to learn more about supported internships in Warwickshire. Supported internships are work-based study programmes for young people, aged 16 to 24, who have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) and want to move into employment, but need some extra support.

This free event will offer a unique opportunity to:

- Learn about the new guidance developed by Warwickshire County Council to improve information available for young people, their parents and carers and businesses and colleges about supported internships, the benefits and what is involved
- Hear real stories of successful supported internships from previous interns and business hosts
- Find out where to access information about supported internships on Warwickshire's Local Offer pages
- Gain valuable information and network with partner agencies including local colleges, Warwickshire Skills Hub and more.

Who should attend

- Headteachers/principals, SENCos and career leads from education settings in Warwickshire
- Young people aged 16-24 years with an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP)
- Parents and carers of young people aged 16-24 years with an EHCP
- Local businesses that are interested in hosting supported internships

When and where

The drop-in event will take place on Thursday 14 March 2024, from 3pm to 7pm at the Eliot Park Innovation Centre, Nuneaton, Warwickshire, CV10 7RH. Light refreshments will be provided.

The event will be held on the ground floor and is fully accessible. There will also be a designated quiet space, for anyone who may need time away from the main area.
