I hope this message finds you well. It has been an incredible week at Higham Lane School, and I am thrilled to share some outstanding achievements and exciting updates with you.

### **A Level Success:**

I am delighted to announce that the recently validated A Level data from the summer of 2023 showcases Higham Lane Sixth Form as the highest-performing establishment in North Warwickshire for A Level Results. Our Year 13 students achieved an impressive average grade of a B- with an average point score of 36.51, and 36.75 for their best 3 A Levels. This remarkable accomplishment is a testament to the hard work and dedication of our wonderful students. Notably, the average point score of 36.75 surpasses that of several prestigious schools, including some fee-paying independent schools. Furthermore, 18.5% of our students achieved AAB or higher, with at least 2 facilitating subjects. Congratulations to the Sixth Form Team, our dedicated staff, and our incredible students who have secured places at some of the top universities.

## **Outstanding GCSE Results:**

In addition, the validated GCSE data released this week affirms that Higham Lane is the highest-performing non-selective school in Warwickshire for Grade 5 or above in English and Maths! Our Progress 8 score of +0.57 ranks us as the fourth highest-performing non-selective school. This impressive figure means that, on average, our students gained over half a grade higher in every subject compared to their targeted scores based on Key Stage 2 SATs. This achievement is truly remarkable, and we are immensely proud of our students and staff for their hard work and dedication.

## Inspiring Visit from Author Katie Bishop:

This week, we had the pleasure of hosting a real author as part of our Aspire programme. Approximately 100 students attended a captivating presentation by Katie Bishop, a Higham Lane alumna.

Katie shared her inspiring journey of overcoming rejection in her career to become a successful published author.

Her book, "The Girls of Summer," has received numerous awards, and we are proud to have played a part in her literary journey.

The students were engaged, attentive, and asked insightful questions, making the event a tremendous success.
