Feeling Safe

The safety and well-being of every child at Higham Lane School is paramount. I was recently very concerned to read a Fisher Family Trust report highlighting that only 40% of girls in the UK felt safe at school before the pandemic, and this number has sadly fallen to just 26% nationwide post-pandemic. This statistic is simply shocking and underscores the importance of our ongoing work in this area.

At HLS, we utilise a range of strategies to foster a safe environment for all our students. This includes theatre productions and sessions on anti-bullying and online safety, dedicated assemblies, our tutor time programme, weekly Personal Development lessons and bespoke interventions where needed, to proactively reduce incidents that may make our female students feel unsafe. Encouragingly, a recent HLS student survey indicated that the vast majority of our female students do feel safe at Higham Lane School. However, if you have any concerns that your child does not feel safe in school, please do not hesitate to contact us so we can offer appropriate signposting and support. We are committed to ensuring every child feels secure and supported within our school community.

Virtual Reality (VR) Headsets

We are excited to be offering our students the opportunity to use VR headsets on a rolling basis as part of violence and knife crime workshops run by the police. These immersive experiences provide realistic scenarios where students can pause, reflect and discuss how they might handle different situations to ensure their safety. This innovative approach allows for valuable learning and discussion in a safe and engaging environment. I was speaking to the police officers today who are leading the sessions and the feedback from our students has been incredible in relation to the VR sessions.

Year 10 Calling it Out Theatre Production

All Year 10 students will be participating in a powerful theatre production and workshops led by the Loudmouth Theatre Company on Tuesday 13th May. This important initiative focuses on crucial topics such as harmful sexual behaviours, sexual harassment, sexual assault, pornography, consent and misogyny. We believe this will provide our students with valuable insights and promote respectful relationships.

Safeguarding and Online Safety

Our staff received expert training this week on harmful online content, with a particular focus on ideologies such as 'incels'. This training equips our staff to be more aware of potentially concerning remarks from students or worrying content in their work, enabling us to take appropriate steps to help protect students who may be at risk. We have also further trained staff on the procedures to follow to support students who may be vulnerable.

The UK Safer Internet Centre offers valuable advice for parents and carers regarding online safety. They recommend talking to your child about responsible phone use, discussing what to do if something upsetting or worrying happens online, and exploring parental controls and monitoring phone usage to ensure your child's safety.
