Sixth Form Success and Online Safety Reminders

Today, Friday, saw a very successful New Year 12 Experience Day, giving our current Year 11 students a taste of A-level lessons in preparation for next year. We are incredibly fortunate at Higham Lane School to have an oversubscribed Sixth Form. Last year, we achieved the highest average point score for A-levels of all schools in North Warwickshire and the third highest in the whole of Warwickshire, and we are the only Sixth Form in the area with a positive value-added score. We look forward to welcoming so many of our current Year 11 students back in the autumn term as they embark on their A-levels here at HLS.

Important Safeguarding Information: Mobile Phone Use

Finally, I want to address an important safeguarding matter. We've seen an increase in safeguarding concerns recently related to students' mobile phone use, often late at night. We strongly recommend that your child does not take their phone to their bedroom when they go to bed at night. We advise keeping it downstairs or even in your room. This allows your child to get a good night's sleep, disrupted sleep can significantly impact concentration and attitude the following day. Please also regularly speak to your child about online safety and check through their phone to ensure they are not accessing inappropriate material or engaging in unkind or potentially illegal activity.
