GCSE English Language:

Component 1: Prose Fiction and Writing a Story

<u>TO DO:</u>

- 1. <u>SECTION A:</u> Work through the Component 1 Practice Exam Papers pack under timed conditions.
- 2. SECTION B: Narrative writing students should have 3-4 PERFECT stories stuck into their ORANGE BOOKS by the end of the Easter holiday.

Ensure that the PRE-PREPARED stories can fit these broad titles:

- Being in trouble
- The celebration
- A learning moment
- An important event/moment

Use time now to write NEW NARRATIVE/IMPROVE narratives if unhappy with existing ones. Remember- a perfect story:

- ✓ NO SPaG errors
- ✓ Interesting hook/ opening paragraph
- ✓ Structural feature flashback or repeated motif
- ✓ Impact ending
- \checkmark Crafted sentences and ambitious vocabulary
- ✓ BE INTERESTING!



GCSE English Language:

Component 2: Non-fiction and Transactional Writing

TO DO:

- 1. SECTION A: Work through the Component 2 Practice Exam Papers pack under timed conditions.
- 2. SECTION B: Practice all 7 Transactional Writing tasks:
 - Know the format for each (use the formats taught in class)
 - Practice planning and writing under timed conditions
 - Ensure that writing is:
 - ✓ Accurate and controlled : fix weak SPaG points
 - Developed interestingly with a clear LINE OF ARGUMENT and SOFEA
 - ✓ **Crafted** using AFOREST and other techniques in booklet
 - ✓ Interesting: vary sentence openers, ambitious vocabulary, strong ending.



GCSE English Literature

- **Component 1:** Macbeth and Anthology Poetry
- Component 2: A Christmas Carol, An Inspector Calls and Unseen Poetry

REVISION PRIORITIES:

- ✓ **STEP 1: Be clear about THE STORY** of each text and poem
- STEP 2: What is the 'journey' of the main characters- LEARN THESE PLANS (these 'journeys' are the backbone of BOTH character AND theme essays e.g. Macbeth's journey is ALSO the content for a theme essay on ambition, power/control, violence, kingship etc)
- ✓ STEP 3: KNOW YOUR QUOTATIONS and what to say about them (AO2 is everything!)
- STEP 4: PRACTICE WRITING TIMED RESPONSES OR CREATE PLANS
 (20 mins/40 mins/45 mins). Use Orange Book Assessments for guidance.
